Gerald is mentioned by the Four Masters twice in 1497, ie 29 years before he became Chieftain when his father's cousin Sean was Chieftain

M1497.3 Gerald is listed as one of those who slew Egneghan, the son of Naghtan, who was son of Turlough-an-Fhiona O'Donnell, in the camp of Hugh Roe O'Donnell.

M1497.7 Gerald is listed as one of the prisoners taken at Seaghais when Con O'Donnell led an army against Mac Dermot of Moylurg and was defeated

Sir Anthony St. Leger on 3 Dec. 1541. (Burke's Peerage.)

There is one source that states that he married Rose, a daughter of Shane O'Neill. This was by the Most Rev. Dr. O'Doherty, Bishop of Derry in his book "Derriana", Sealy, Bryers and Walker, M.H. Gill and Son, 50 Upper O'Connell St., Dublin, Ireland, 1902. "Burkes Landed Gentry" also states that John Oge married a Rose O'Neill, daughter of Shane O'Neill who was prince of Tyrone, pp. 185. Or was it Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Owen McTool McSwiney. This according to Co. of Louth Archaeological Journal, (The Chamberlains of Nizelrath) Vol 11, (1941-44) Pages 175-185. See Bonners Book: "That Audacious Traitor".

He was a Knight, Lord and chief of Inishowen

Perhaps he married both.
